About the Project

- Brighton Park is in USDA Zone 8B (parts of our zipcode are in 8A), with significant microclimates due to areas with full sun, full shade, etc
- Goal is to add variety to our landscape, but still have continuity
- Add drought-tolerant plants

Goals

- Recommend hardy plants that thrive in our Zone
- Slowly exchange plants that require extensive pruning with plants that do not require shaping and rarely need to be pruned
- Add texture and color to our landscape
- Monitor trees with extensive roots
- Exchange trees that drop material on cars and surfaces
